The NYRx E&O team serves as a liaison between all stakeholders and NYRx to support care coordination. Clinical liaisons are trained to support and help solve complex pharmacy cases for:

- Managed Care Plans
- Case workers and NYS agencies
- Prescribers and pharmacies with questions regarding NYRx drug coverage, prior approval requirements, and NYRx enrolled pharmacies
- Complex care coordination for populations such as HIV/AIDS, Hemophilia, Foster Care Children, Serious Mental Illness, Substance Use Disorder, and Hepatitis C

TRANSITIONAL SUPPORT

Chafee Foster Care Program

The [Chafee Foster Care Program for Successful Transition to Adulthood](#) (CFCP) assists current and former youth in foster care to achieve self-sufficiency. In New York State, allocations are made to local social service departments based on the potential independent living (IL) population.

There are five eligibility criteria:

- Youth in foster care at **age 14 – 21** years of age who are provided IL services.
- Youth who have aged out of foster care at **age 18, 19, or 20** can be provided IL services up to their *21st birthday*.
- Youth who have exited foster care to adoption or legal guardianship at **age 16** can be provided IL services up to their *21st birthday*.
- Youth who were in foster care at **age 14 or older** and have exited foster care for reasons other than adoption, legal guardianship, or aging out of foster care can be provided IL services up to their *21st birthday*.
- Youth who aged out of foster care at **age 21** may be provided IL services up to their *23rd birthday*, which are intended to compliment the efforts of the youth to maintain self-sufficiency.

CFCP services include but are not limited to academic support, employment programs, vocational programs, housing, financial literacy, and career preparation.

Chafee Funds Program - Beyond of New York State

The Office of Children and Family Services (OCFS) currently offers limited financial awards from \$300 to \$1000 to young adults, ages 18 through 22 years old, transitioning from foster care. For more information, eligibility requirements and to apply visit <https://chafeeny.smapply.org/>.



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
