

# NYRx, the Medicaid Pharmacy Program Information for Pharmacies

NYRx, the Medicaid Pharmacy Program, provides the prescription drug benefit for all New York State (NYS) Medicaid members enrolled in a Mainstream Managed Care Plan, Health and Recovery Plan (HARP), HIV-Special Needs Plan (HIV-SNP), and fee-for-service. NYRx covers medically necessary FDA-approved prescription and non-prescription drugs.

- Select drugs and drug classes are subject to specific <u>NYRx program requirements</u>.

#### What Pharmacies Need to Know

- All providers who service NYS Medicaid members must be enrolled in NYS Medicaid. However, there is an exception for unlicensed interns, residents, and foreign physicians in training programs.
  - Pharmacy claims will receive a reject code/POS rejection message for prescriptions submitted with a non-enrolled prescriber.
    - National Council for Prescription Drug Programs (NCPDP) Reject code 889: Prescriber
      Not Enrolled in State Medicaid Program (eMedNY edit code 02218).
  - For information on how to override reject code 889, for the unlicensed resident, intern, or foreign physician in a training program, or OOS prescription situations, pharmacies should refer to the <u>Medicaid Update Vol 39 Number 14</u>, <u>September 2023 article</u> entitled *Reminder: Unlicensed Interns, Residents and Foreign Physicians in Training Programs as Prescribers*.
- Drugs subject to NYRx pharmacy programs are found in the NYRx Preferred Drug List (PDL).
  - Preferred drugs generally do not require prior authorization (PA) when prescribed according to FDA labeling.
  - Drugs on the <u>PDL</u> may also be subject to other NYRx pharmacy programs including the <u>Brand Less Than the Generic (BLTG) Program</u>, <u>Dose Optimization (DO) criteria requirements</u>, or <u>Drug Utilization Review (DUR) Program</u>.
    - The <u>DUR</u> program looks for select clinical criteria such as use for an FDA-approved indication, prior trial of a drug from another drug class as supported by FDA label or professional treatment guidelines, also known as <u>Step Therapy (ST)</u>, or <u>Frequency/Quantity/Duration (F/Q/D)</u> limits.



- The <u>NYRx Preferred Drug Quick List</u> is a quick reference guide that lists only the preferred drugs by therapeutic category and drug class.
- Prior authorization (PA) may not be needed if the clinical criteria requirements are found in the member's Medicaid claim history at the time of the pharmacy claim submission.
  - All applicable diagnosis codes should be included in a member's electronic medical record (EMR) and claims should be submitted in a timely manner to decrease the need to manually obtain PA.

## **Pharmacy Claim Edits**

- Pharmacy providers should refer to the NYRx top edit resource sheet found in the *Useful Links* section of the <u>eMedNY website</u> or the <u>NYRx Top Claim Edit training video</u> for further assistance on how to resolve claim edits.
  - Rejections (ex: eligibility, COB, Medicare Part D) should be resolved prior to requesting a PA from the prescriber.
  - o Duplicate PA requests should not be sent to the prescriber.

## NYRx Education & Outreach

The NYRx Education & Outreach team assists the NYS Department of Health (DOH) and its stakeholders by ensuring members receive their medications in a timely manner, facilitating intervention and access for medically complex cases, and providing detailed information about NYRx drug coverage, prior approval requirements, and NYRx enrolled pharmacies.

- The NYRx Education & Outreach team serves as a resource for NYRx program-related questions and offers educational opportunities.
- The <u>NYRx Education & Outreach website</u> provides additional information about the NYRx pharmacy programs.
- In addition, the NYRx Education & Outreach team has a call center staffed with clinical liaisons, who are trained to support complex pharmacy cases, specifically for members who are transgender, have HIV/AIDs or Hemophilia, are in Foster Care, have Serious Mental Illness, Substance Use Disorder, or Hepatitis C.
