

# NYRx Formulary Update: Hydroxym (hydrocortisone gel)

## What Pharmacy Providers and Prescribers Need to Know

Effective **March 20, 2025**, in accordance with a NYRx, the Medicaid Pharmacy Program policy update, Hydroxym will no longer be covered and will reject at the pharmacy as NCPDP 70 - Product/Service Not Covered - Plan/Benefit Exclusion.

NYRx covers medically necessary, FDA-approved drugs for Medicaid-covered indications. Hydroxym is not an FDA-approved drug. Some unapproved drugs are allowed to remain in the marketplace due to Food and Drug Administration (FDA) exceptions; however, these drugs have not been evaluated for safety and efficacy.

#### Prescribers should switch their patients to a preferred low-potency topical steroid product.

Preferred low-potency topical steroids will not require prior authorization (PA) if they are prescribed within FDA guidelines. Non-preferred drugs will require a PA.

**Note:** Hydroxym is no longer a covered drug. Previously approved PAs for Hydroxym will no longer be active and future requests are **not** available.
