NYRx Drug Utilization Review Program

Drugs in the Lidocaine Patches drug class require prior authorization (PA) under the <u>NYRx Drug</u> <u>Utilization Review (DUR) Program</u>:

Drug / Class Name	Step Therapy (ST) Parameters	Frequency / Quantity / Duration (F/Q/D) Parameters	Additional / Alternate Parameter(s)
Lidocaine patches • lidocaine 5% patch (Lidoderm®) • lidocaine 1.8% patch (ZTLido™)	Trial of an alternate first line agent to treat diagnosis	Maximum 3 patches per day Prescriptions can be written for a 30-day supply with up to 2 refills	Confirm diagnosis of FDA- approved or compendia- supported indication and Medicaid covered indication

Prior Authorization Requirements

- Confirm diagnosis of an FDA-approved or compendia-supported and Medicaid covered indication.
- Trial of an alternate first line agent to treat the diagnosis is necessary to meet the <u>NYRx Step Therapy (ST)</u> requirement.
- Prescriptions can be written for a maximum of three patches per day for up to a 30-day supply with up to two refills.

Ways to Submit a Prior Authorization to NYRx

- NYRx, the Medicaid Pharmacy Program, accepts electronic prior authorization (ePA) requests via <u>CoverMyMeds</u>. Electronic prior authorization is the most effective and efficient way to submit a prior authorization. Third-Party Liability & Coordination of Benefits

- Third-party liability (TPL) means there is an insurer, in addition to Medicaid, responsible for paying some or all of a person's medical costs. TPL providers could be commercial health plans or Medicare.
- Coordination of benefits (COB) is the process used to determine how medical services, including prescriptions, will be covered when a person has TPL.
- Medicaid is always the payor of last resort; federal regulations require that all other available resources be exhausted before Medicaid considers payment.
- COB ensures the correct party pays first.
