Dear Prescriber:

On November 15, 2012, the New York State Medicaid Pharmacy & Therapeutics Committee recommended changes to the Medicaid pharmacy prior authorization programs. The Commissioner of Health has reviewed the recommendations of the committee and has approved changes to the Preferred Drug Program (PDP) and the Clinical Drug Review Program within the fee-for-service pharmacy program. Effective February 21, 2013, prior authorization (PA) requirements will change for some drugs in the following PDP classes:

- Carbamazepine Derivatives
- Growth Hormones
- Other Agents for ADHD
- Second Generation Anticonvulsants

In addition, the CDRP will expand to include the following:

- Anabolic Steroids
- Central Nervous System Stimulants
- Truvada (for Pre-Exposure Prophylaxis (PrEP))

Please note that PA requirements are not dependent on the date a prescription is written. New prescriptions and refills on existing prescriptions require PA even if the prescription was written before the date the drug was determined to require PA. The Preferred Drug List (PDL) and additional information, such as updated PA forms and clinical criteria for the PDP and Clinical Drug Review Program (CDRP) are available at the following websites:

To obtain a PA, please call the prior authorization clinical call center at 1-877-309-9493. The clinical call center is available 24 hours per day, 7 days per week with pharmacy technicians and pharmacists who will work with you, or your agent, to quickly obtain PA.

Medicaid enrolled prescribers can also initiate PA requests using a web-based application. PAXpress® is a web based pharmacy PA request/response application accessible through a new button "PAXpress" located on eMedNY.org under the MEIPASS button.
