

NYRx Medicaid Pharmacy Prior Authorization Programs Update

On October 25, 2024, the New York State Medicaid Drug Utilization Review Board (DURB) recommended changes to NYRx, the Medicaid pharmacy prior authorization (PA) program. The Commissioner of Health has reviewed the recommendations of the Board and has approved changes to the NYRx Preferred Drug Program (PDP) within the fee-for-service (FFS) pharmacy program.

Effective **February 6, 2025**, PA requirements will change for some drugs in the following PDP classes:

- Insulin Long-Acting
- Sodium Glucose Co-Transporter 2 (SGLT2) Inhibitors

Effective **April 1**, **2025**, coverage will change for the following over-the-counter (OTC) products:

- OTC nasal products containing oxymetazoline will be removed from the Medicaid Pharmacy List of Reimbursable Drugs.
- OTC oral products containing phenylephrine will be removed from the Medicaid Pharmacy List of Reimbursable Drugs.
- OTC oral products containing simethicone will be removed from the Medicaid Pharmacy List of Reimbursable Drugs.
- OTC glucose tablets will be removed from the Medicaid Pharmacy List of Reimbursable Drugs.
- OTC topical products containing bacitracin or neomycin will be removed from the Medicaid Pharmacy List of Reimbursable Drugs.
- OTC multivitamins to remain on the Medicaid Pharmacy List of Reimbursable Drugs with an age edit in place allowing coverage for members less than 21 years of age. This age edit does not include prenatal multivitamins.
